

President's Message ~ Bob Arndt

I would like to welcome new board members Peter Foy, Eric Olson, Mike Amstadt and Kris Heckman. I will also take this opportunity to thank departing officers and board members Joe Edgerton, Brad Wagner, John Olsen, and Jim Schoeberl for their services over the past years.

As spring, and spring elections approach, lake residents should examine candidates' positions on issues affecting them. Two obvious issues are shoreland zoning and lake levels. Little has happened with regard to shoreland zoning in the past few months, but lake levels could continue to be a hot issue. All of the lakes are still at or near summer maximums, which means spring rains could easily produce flooding. Susan Josheff (DNR) made a presentation on lake flooding and proposed solutions at the FOLKS annual meeting in January. One part of the current proposals that would affect Lake Kegonsa residents the most, is a clause that would allow for an "emergency drawdown" of Lake Kegonsa. This would allow Dane County Land and Water Resources Director, Kevin Connors, to open the LaFollette lock and dam to draw Lake Kegonsa down below the "summer minimum" established by the DNR. The purported purpose is to increase the head (difference in levels) between Waubesa and Kegonsa and thereby increase the flow out of Lake Waubesa. We are very aware of what happened in August last year when the lake was drawn down just 2" below the summer minimum.

If you have any concerns or suggestions, or would like to get involved, please feel free to contact me, or any of the board members listed on the last page of this newsletter and on our website (www.kegonsa.org). As always, phone numbers and email addresses for all officers and board members are included.

Lets hope for a better year on the lake.

Fisheries Committee Report

Valentines Day 2009 was not your typical day in regards to giving something to the one you love. Yes this is a love story, yes we are talking about the fisheries committee, and yes we are talking about the one we love – Lake Kegonsa.

On this day some members from the fisheries committee headed by Jim Gray a Folks Board Member rounded up some volunteers from the Madison Huber Center, DNR and friends who after 6 hours of hard labor were scratching their heads wondering why they didn't have something better to do that day. Actually everybody had fun, got fed, nobody got hurt and gifts for the lake were made. If you can't be fishing this is considered a great day.

Now, you probably want to know what kind of gifts you give to a lake; Fish cribs of course! Our volunteer DNR friends on this day told us Lake Kegonsa's bottom is shaped like a bowl thus has very little structure for fish to hide and mature. That is changing; we now have 31 newly made fish cribs to place in the lake. They will be in place before May 1st and your dreams of catching a mountable large one may not be far off. Are you excited? You should be! Your friendly FOLKS fisheries committee is, but we are always excited when we talk about fishing.

For you technical, got to know exactly what we built individuals, I will stop tormenting you now and do my best to explain (see picture below). First we had to notch a couple of logs then put them together to form an X. With the X shaped logs standing up we then put a larger log in the middle of that X and attached it in a cannon looking configuration. They will be placed in the lake with blocks chained to them to make sure they sink and stay in place.

The location of these cribs is super top secret, a matter of national security that only the Governor knows, just kidding. Actually, since they haven't even been placed, we can't really tell you where they are going. But we will happily update you in the future.



Lake Kegonsa Fall 2008 Fisheries Survey Notes

In late October 2008, DNR fisheries staff electro-fished Lake Kegonsa. This effort completed our comprehensive sampling of the lake which included a spring netting sample as well as a spring electro-fishing event. A comprehensive survey helps quantify pike and walleye stocks, and describes the relative proportion of quality sized gamefish in a given waterbody. Fall samples are typically used to look at recruitment- the term for how well the fish reproduced and survived from this years' spawn. We want to see good numbers of young fish which are vulnerable in the fall because they frequent the shallows where the boat works. The entire shoreline is shocked and various metrics are calculated to characterize the sample, and by default, the entire fishery.

The Lake Kegonsa Sailing Club is starting the 2009 sailing season early and with a pledge to get people involved in the sport of sailing. To that end we have scheduled a number of educational and entertaining events this spring and summer for sailors and spectators too.

The great part about sailing, other than the pure fun of it, is: No air pollution, No water pollution, No noise pollution. No gasoline expense.

There are many levels of participation from just floating around a lake to racing in the many racing events in our area. Sailors are well known for their willingness to share knowledge of the sport with anyone interested.

The LKSC is putting on seminars this spring at Halverson's Restaurant on Hwy 51 north of Stoughton

Wednesday, April 22: Sailing and Sail Trim - The shape of a sail can be adjusted to improve boat performance. In this seminar participants will learn how to trim their sail(s) for a more thrilling and pleasurable sailing experience. Even beginning racers will learn much from this seminar. Beginners are always welcome to attend our seminars and ask questions, we always have a group of experienced sailors to help you.

Our first Official Race is May 16, 2009 - The Syttende Mai Regatta. This race is open to the public and is a mass start with Portsmouth Handicap scoring. All information about this race will be on our web site: www.lksc.org The Syttende Mai Regatta headquarters is at Pleasant Springs Boat Landing on Lake Kegonsa. Spectators can watch from there or from Springers Restaurant on Sunnyside Drive. Sailors will also congregate at Springers for lunch and for the skippers meeting prior to the race, which starts around 1pm.

During the summer the LKSC has races every Thursday evening at 6:30pm and Sunday afternoon at 3:00pm. These are open, handicapped scored (Portsmouth) races that anyone can participate in. If you are a club member, you are scored in the race. Always check the web site www.lksc.org to see if a race is ON or may have been cancelled due to weather.

A note to sailors who have never raced: Racing is the absolute best way to improve your sailing skills. Our races are laid back and recreational.

The LKSC also has a number of "FUN" sailing events during the summer that are not races but incorporate some aspects of racing. They are a great way to learn how to sail and have a fun time too.
